Tier III Flexibility

Gave authorization to districts to use funds received for any "Tier III" program to be utilized for "any educational purpose" from 2008-09 through 2012-13:

•All program requirements and compliance issues are waived for Tier III programs

Background (continued)

ABX4 2, Education Code Section, 42605, paragraph (c) (2) and (3) requires an <u>annual</u> public hearing on the proposed use of funds for the Tier III Categorical Programs.

Paragraph 2 was amended to read,

- (2) As a condition of receipt of funds, the governing board of the school district or board of the county office of education, as appropriate, at a regularly scheduled open public hearing shall take testimony from the public, discuss, approve or disapprove the proposed use of funding, and make explicit for each of the budget items in paragraph (2) of subdivision
- (a) the purpose for which the funds will be used.
