Item Title: Resolution No. 11-0029 Approval of Paden, Ruby Bridges

Boundary Changes

Item Type: Action

BACKGROUND: In an effort to ease over-crowding at Ruby Bridges and to address under-enrollment at Paden Elementary School, a boundary change is necessary. Tonight we are asking for the Board of Education to approve the boundary change that was presented as an informational item on March 29, 2011. As requested by the Board, listed below are frequently asked questions to help clarify the effects of the boundary change and the ways in which AUSD staff have engaged the community.

Question: Will students currently attending Ruby Bridges have to leave next year and go to Paden?

<u>Answer:</u> No. All students currently attending Ruby Bridges will not be told to leave. Only new students entering AUSD will be affected by a boundary change. <u>Question:</u> I have a 1st grader and a 4th grader at Ruby Bridges. My kindergartener is entering next year. Will I have to enroll my children at two different schools? <u>Answer:</u> No. We are recommending that new kindergarteners are allowed to attend Ruby Bridges if their older siblings are currently attending.

Question: I do not live in the Paden attendance zone, but I have a kindergartener that goes to Paden. Will my student be redirected to our home school if new students enter?

<u>Answer</u>: If this boundary is approved by the Board of Education, all currently enrolled intra-district students at Paden will assume residency status.

Question: Why is the boundary drawn the way it is?

<u>Answer</u>: Staff looked at many different scenarios. This scenario includes up to 130 new families over the next 5 years. The other scenarios included too many families, and Paden would not have enough space to house these students. Question: Will you move SDC classes from Paden?

<u>Answer</u>: SDC classes are placed at school sites by space available and need in the area. Looking at the next 5 years, it is not likely we would move an SDC class. <u>Question</u>: If the boundary change happens, how many new students do you expect at Paden next year due to the boundary change?

Answer: Between 15 and 25 new students.

Staff have engaged the community in the following ways:

- ❖ Slides were provided in Scenario B Presentations showing how Ruby Bridges is over-crowded and will need a boundary change regardless of the parcel tax outcome.
- ❖ Maps and proposed boundary change slides were presented at the Board meeting on November 9, 2010.
- ❖ Staff met with the office staff and principals of Ruby Bridges and Paden in January to address the concerns of a boundary change during K roundup.
- ❖ A letter went out in January to any new family pre-enrolling for kindergarten that lives in the proposed zone of change to inform them about the possible change of boundary.
- ❖ The same letter listed above was left at the Esperanza community center, Head Start preschool located at the Esperanza community and Home Sweet home located across the street from the Esperanza community.
- ❖ Powerpoint and proposal were shared at the March 22nd Board meeting.
- ❖ Paden and Ruby Bridges principals worked with their PTA's and school communities to address the possible change in boundary. Administrators shared the March 22nd powerpoint and gathered questions and concerns.
- * AUSD has met with the Boys and Girls Club, Multi-Cultural Center, Head Start, the Esperanza housing manager and other agencies to help get out the correct information about the proposed boundary change.
- ❖ The AUSD Coordinator of Student Services has worked with the principal of Ruby Bridges and PTA president to respond to concerns of the continued growth at Ruby Bridges that a boundary change would not address.
- ❖ AUSD staff met with families from the Esperanza community to give them information about what would occur with a boundary change.
- ❖ AUSD staff met with Head Start families to encourage kindergarten enrollment and give information on the possible boundary change.

- ❖ AUSD staff met with Paden PTA to answer questions about what effects the boundary change would have on the Paden population.
- ❖ District Office has been working with Ruby Bridges and Paden alike to offer support and answer questions.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: None.

RECOMMENDATION: Review and approve the school attendance boundaries that will help address enrollment concerns at both Paden and Ruby Bridges.



Current Enrollment at Ruby Bridges



- *This proposed boundary change will ease overcrowding at Ruby Bridges and will efficiently use our existing facilities at Paden.









Enrollment at Paden if boundary existed at Atlantic



Ramifications and Effects of Change

The boundary will affect families living on the following streets:

- •1700 block of 5th Street
- •1700 block of Webster Street
- •1700-1900 block of 3rd Street
- •2nd Street
- ·Cypress Street
- ·Brush Street
- ·Maple Street
- Spruce Street

This will increase the distance that some families will have to travel to their resident school. Staff mapped the furthest address from Paden which was on Maple Street. Currently that address is 0.4 miles from Ruby Bridges. This represents a 7 minute walk or 2 minute drive. The change to Paden would increase the distance to 0.8 miles. This represents a 16 minute walk or 4 minute drive.

RESOLUTION NO. 11-0029 GOVERNING BOARD OF THE ALAMEDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT Approval of the Change of Paden and Ruby Bridges Elementary School Boundaries

WHEREAS, the Board of Education approved the Alameda Unified School District Master Plan acknowledging the community's value for quality neighborhood elementary schools and a vision of creating attractive school options; and

WHEREAS, there is over-crowding at Ruby Bridges Elementary School and under-enrollment at Paden Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends AUSD change the school attendance boundaries to address these enrollment concerns at Ruby Bridges and Paden by changing the existing line on Pacific Avenue to Buena Vista Avenue and up Poggi Street north to Ralph Appezzato Memorial Way west to the bay; and

WHEREAS, families residing on the 400-699 block of Buena Vista Avenue shall have their choice of either school; and

WHEREAS, the boundary change shall be instituted only for new students enrolling at these schools; and

WHEREAS, families of currently enrolled students at Ruby Bridges Elementary School may elect to keep current students and incoming siblings at Ruby Bridges through 2015-2016; and

WHEREAS, students currently enrolled as intra-district students at Paden Elementary School may elect to assume residency status with the approval of this resolution;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that school attendance boundaries surrounding Ruby Bridges and Paden Elementary Schools now change as described to address aforementioned enrollment concerns.
