BACKGROUND: The February 2009 Budget Act authorized Tier III Categorical Flexibility. It gave authorization to districts to use funds received for any "Tier III" Program to be utilized for "any educational purpose" from 2008-09 through 2012-13.

Additionally, on March 24, 2011, Governor Brown signed a bill providing a 2 year extension to Tier III Categorical Flexibility, through 2014-15.

Utilization of Tier III Flexibility will provide the District with the ability to maximize financial resources and provide needed flexibility in maintaining a balanced budget.

This report seeks to inform the Board of Education on new systems for tracking and maintaining Tier III Flexibility and its proposed utilization for 2011-12. Tier III Categorical Flexibility will need to be authorized at budget adoption on June 29, 2011.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: Budgeting of \$6,214,082 in Tier III Categorical Funds.

RECOMMENDATION: Receive proposed Categorical Flexibility as submitted.
