**Item Title:** Retiering Proposed Cuts for 2011/12

**Item Type**: Information

**BACKGROUND:** On November 23, 2010 in accordance with Education Code 42130 the Alameda Unified School District will adopt and present to the Alameda County Office of Education its first interim budget for 2010-2011.

On June 29, 2010 the School Board passed a budget with a positive certification. The budget presented included cuts in spending to maintain a balanced and "positive" certification over three years.

Included in this presentation are a summary of the first year (Phase 1) reductions and a draft outline of possible additional cuts in support of maintaining a positive fund balance.

This report seeks to inform the board and community of the strategic budget reductions that are available in closing a \$4 million dollar budget gap in 2011-12 and a \$7 million budget gap in 2012-13.

This report is an update to the September 28<sup>th</sup> and October 26<sup>th</sup> board presentations. Information presented summarizes stakeholder input on critical reductions needed during the state fiscal crisis.

**FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:** \$4 million in reduction 2011-12 and \$7 million in 2012-13
