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Tiered Accountability System

Reporting of Individual School Progress

- Absolute Performance. How is the school performing against Adequate Yearly Progress Targets?
- Cohort Matched Student Level Growth. How is the school accelerating growth for students who have been in the school over time (measured for one, two and three years)?
- Closing the Achievement Gap. Is the school closing the gap between school wide performance and that of the lowest performing subgroup?

Tiered Accountability System

School sites will be ranked or "Tiered" annually with a color scale from Blue to Red.

 - Majority RED on Growth
