-\$6.6 billion in 2009-10 -\$12.3 billion in 2010-11

\$19.9 billion total

	Amount (In Billions)	<u>Percent</u>
Cuts	\$8.5	43%
Federal Funds	\$6.9	35%
Alternative Funding	\$3.9	20%
Other	\$0.6	3%

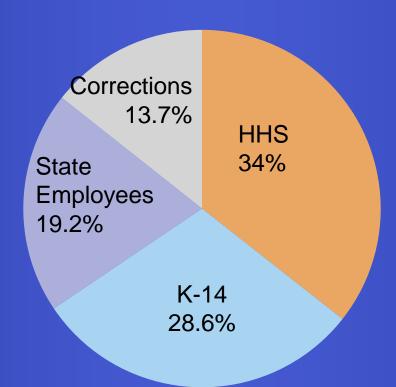
## Federal Funding

- \$2.1 billion from extended ARRA funding
- \$4.8 billion in new federal funding

## Triggered Adjustments

- \$4.6 billion in additional spending cuts
- \$2.4 billion in additional revenue

## **Proposition 98**

Governor proposes actions that would reduce the guarantee by:

- •\$892.6 million in 2009-10
- •\$1.54 billion in 2010-11

## Proposed K-12 Cuts Current Year

\$340 million (K-3 CSR) \$228 (Baseline adjustments)

\$568 million (Total)

## Proposed K-12 Cuts Budget Year

- Revenue Limits
  - -\$1.2 billion (administration)
  - -\$300 million (contracting out)
  - -\$229.5 million (negative COLA)
- K-3 CSR \$550 million
- · COEs \$45 million

# Proposed Statutory Changes

- Teacher seniority
- Substitute teachers
- Layoff notifications
- Shorter school year (5 days)

#### Waiver Needed

Proposed K-12 funding in 2010-11 is \$600 million below federal ARRA maintenance of effort requirement

### **LAO Reaction**

"Reasonable estimate of the problem...but some downside risk."

### **LAO** Reaction

"Correct to seek additional federal relief...but not realistic to expect all the federal relief assumed."

### **LAO** Reaction

"The Legislature must make very difficult choices affecting both state reveues and spending."

## Big Questions Remain

- Is the proposal constitutional?
- Will waiver be approved?
- Will gas tax proposal be approved?
