#### Ardella Dailey Named Superintendent of Alameda Schools

The Board of Education voted November 8 to appoint Interim Superintendent Ardella Dailey as the permanent Superintendent of Schools for the Alameda Unified School District. Ms. Dailey was interviewed by the Board on November 1, based on selection criteria gathered from a community-wide input process. The appointment was made official at the Tuesday night board meeting. Ms. Dailey has been serving the district as the interim superintendent since July 2005. She is a 20-year employee of the Alameda Unified School District. She was assistant superintendent for educational services for the past five years and earlier served as principal of Miller Elementary School and director of the Woodstock Child Development Center.
